Alternative Models of Preventive Oral Health Care Delivery Panel Discussion

Three presentations will review the development of alternative health care delivery systems.



Ron Nagel, DDS, MPH

This model will discuss training of the first Alaska Dental Therapists in New Zealand as well as deployment strategies, scope of practice and the resolution of legal issues. Included in this presentation is the description of quality assurance and certification in the program, supervision, and administrative control, as well as an update on the current status of the program.

Dr. Nagle graduated from Emory University School of Dentistry in 1987 and completed a Masters Degree in Public Health at the John Burns School of Medicine and an advance general practice residency program at the Public Health Service hospital at Gallup, New Mexico. During his 21 year career with the U.S. Public Health Service, Dr. Nagel has been the dental director at three clinical programs and represented the trust territory of the Northern Marianas as a member of the Association of State and Territorial Dental Directors from 1992-1997. While stationed in the Western Pacific, Dr. Nagel directed a World Health Organization Collaborative site; providing education in public health dentistry for W.H.O. fellows from around the world.



Ann Battrell, RDH, MSDH

ADHA first proposed a dental mid-level provider, the Advanced Dental Hygiene Practitioner (ADHP) in 2004. Since that time other mid-level provider models have emerged and various states have begun to develop dental-hygiene workforce models based upon the competences established for the ADHP model. Ann's presentation will include a discussion of the evolution of ADHA's workforce policies, educational initiatives, and state advocacy initiatives.

Ms. Battrell has served as the executive director of the Chicago-based American Dental Hygienists' Association (ADHA) since July 2005. She is the first registered dental hygienist and the first former ADHA president to serve in this position. Ms. Battrell holds a certificate and bachelors degree in dental hygiene from Northwestern University in Chicago. She earned a master's degree in dental hygiene from the University of Missouri—Kansas City, School of Dentistry in 2007. Ms. Battrell has held dental hygiene faculty positions at Northwestern University Dental School in Chicago and Palm Beach Community College in Palm Beach, Fla.



Lewis N. Lampiris D.D.S., M.P.H.

This session will provide an update on the development of a new member of the dental team, the American Dental Association's Community Dental Health Coordinator (CDHC). The CDHC is from the community which they serve and is responsible for promoting oral health through organized and coordinated community-based oral health promotion and prevention programs. Under the supervision of a dentist, CDHC works in underserved communities where residents have no or limited access to dental care. They are able to influence local health and community organizations in adopting initiatives to promote oral health. CDHCs are currently employed by Federally Qualified Health Centers, the Indian Health Service and tribal clinics serving the dentally underserved. CDHCs implement community oral health care programs, which are integrated with dental clinics, that provide dental treatment to their communities. The CDHC works in collaboration with health and community organizations to promote good oral health and to provide community-focused oral health promotion, prevention, and coordination of dental care.

Dr. Lewis Lampiris currently serves as the Director of the American Dental Association's Council on Access, Prevention and Interprofessional Relations. He received his D.D.S. from Temple University in 1977 and his M.P.H from the University of Illinois at Chicago School of Public Health 1997. He served a dental officer in the U.S. Army Dental Corps at Fort Bragg, N.C. from 1977 through 1981 and then entered private practice in Chicago as a general dentist (1981 – 1994). He served as chief, Division of Oral Health, with the Illinois Department of Public Health (1997 – 2006); prior to that he served as the Dental Program Director of the Midwest AIDS Training and Education Center. He served as the President of the Association of State and Territorial Dental Directors (2004 – 2006) and has an appointment as an Adjunct Instructor, Department of Community and Preventive Dentistry, University of Iowa College of Dentistry. Dr. Lampiris is the recipient of ASTDD's Distinguished Service Award (2007) and the American Dental Association's Presidential Citation (2010). He is a fellow of the American College of Dentists, the Institute of Medicine Chicago, and the Mid-America Public Health Leadership Institute.
